


Americans Support Patient-Centered Solutions, Oppose Government Assigning Value


Concerns with cost-effectiveness assessments

Q: How concerned would you be, if at all, if the government or your health insurance company decided to make health care coverage or payment decisions using these assessments?



Patient-Centered Outcomes Research Institute (PCORI)

Q: How important or unimportant is it for Congress to continue funding PCORI to provide information to doctors and patients on the effectiveness of different treatments for different patients?



Q: If you knew the government or your health insurance company was using the QALY [quality-adjusted life year] standard to set policy, how concerned would you be?

74% reported concern with the government or health insurance companies using the QALY standard.

Nine in 10


92%

believe health care decisions should be made between patients and their doctors.




Safeguarding protections in Medicare

- 2,001 registered voters from February 15-18, 2019
- Results from the survey have a margin of error of $\pm 2\%$
